MAY 2024 PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

RECAP OF THE MOCA MARCH 5, 2024 GENERAL MEETING:

- Thank you to the community residents who attended our first MOCA General Meeting in the newly renovated MOCA Hall. Attendees were most impressed with the Historical Vinyl mural in the foyer hallway.
- The City of Calgary Proposed Blanket Rezoning Policy brought about a conversation about the present City planning & development process. As you read this newsletter, the outcome of the City of Calgary Hearing on the Proposed Blanket Rezoning Policy of the week of April 22nd will probably have been made public. MOCA submitted a letter stating that though there is general support for appropriate redevelopment, especially on major corridors, we shared our concern over the capacity and the age of the existing utility infrastructure in the community, and should the policy be passed, the importance to conduct a closer look at selected areas within a community to ensure the application of a blanket zoning does not impair the streetscape and its general ambiance or bring about a decrease in property value.
- Former legion building demolition: the owner has appealed the City of Calgary demolition order to Court of King's Bench. Hearing date set for May 21.

MOCA MOCA HALL RENOVATION UPDATE:

Lower Hall

- Renovation of the lower hall bathrooms continues. The replacement plumbing is awaiting inspection approval. The contractor to install the new fixtures has set a date for the work and the additional materials required have been ordered. The remaining drywall work is being completed in the next couple of weeks.
- The electrical work has just received a "passed" inspection by the City. The next stage of the electrical work can now proceed.
- The flooring material is being held in the warehouse while we get the floor ready, and all the furniture moved around.
- The replacement ceiling tiles and fire retardant materials are being installed.

Exterior Renovations

- The final revisions for the DP application have been done. The last correspondence received from the City identified that the file was to be sent forward for approval.
- Updated estimates for the accessibility ramp have been requested.
- Updated estimates for the concrete patio and sidewalk work have been requested.
- The installer of the new siding can start once the permit is in place and the elevation of the finished patio can be finalized.

Annex / Office

- As part of the ongoing renovations, we are beginning the process of requesting estimates for the Annex building.
- We continue to be most grateful for our funders: the Royal Canadian Legion - Ogden Branch 154, Legion, the Province of Alberta, the South Calgary Lions Club and MOCA, our community association.

JACK SETTERS ARENA UPDATE:

- Parking lot: MOCA President and MOCA Facilities Director shared concerns over the parking lot drainage system with City of Calgary team including Stephan Horbay, MOCA's NPC. A study will be carried out to look at possible solutions as drainage is a problem at both the east end and the west end of the front of the arena.
- Dasher Boards: Omnisport installed new dasher boards in mid-April. Funding from the CCG (Capital Conservation Grant), City of Calgary.

- Ice-in: Thank you Marsha, MOCA General Manager, for applying for Jack Setters to be the training site for the Arena Level 1 course on August 15th and 16th. As this course focuses on putting ice in, our ice will be put in place as part of this course along with one free registration for one of our facilities attendants. Two of our present facilities attendants took the Arena Operators Level 2 four-day course in mid-April.
- Bird houses: Looking for volunteers to build a couple of bird houses to be mounted on the north wall of the arena where flickers have been peaking holes in the wall and nesting. The holes will be filled with cement and the bird houses will be mounted beside the old holes.

SE CCRC (Southeast Calgary Resource Center):

- Free tax clinic: As of April 17th, Shirley, Career & Employer Counselor, had assisted 71 low income clients with their tax returns. Great service to provide to clients. Thank you Shirley and to the volunteers at the Chartered Professional Accountants of Alberta for their volunteerism which allows us to offer this service to clients with low incomes.
- Crestwood location (2425 69 Ave SE): The Indigenous group working on regalias for their celebrations meets on Wednesday nights and Saturday afternoons.
- A Blooms and Bites Session was held on April 24th.
 Participants created flower arrangements and then engaged
 in some wellness exercises. As the session was such a success,
 plans are to hold a similar session in the near future.
- Mother's Day Celebration: May 9th from 9-11 am and 1-3 pm.
 Serving tea and cookies and giving away purses and carnations.
- Annual Garden Event/Community Clean-up: May 25th from 10 am to 1 pm. Garden soil, seeds, seedlings, expert gardening advice and rock painting. The Tool Lending Shed will also be open for borrowing of gardening tools (lawn mowers, wheel barrows, shovels, shears and more). Coffee and donuts. Soccer Centre dome and artificial turf field upgrade

The Calqary Soccer Centre (CSC), located at 7000 48th Street S.E., will be undergoing improvements including:

- Upgrading the outdoor natural turf field to a full FIFA size 11 v 11 artificial turf field.
- Building an air-supported structure (dome) over the new artificial turf field.
- $\bullet \ \ Constructing \ a \ new \ amenity \ building \ that \ will \ include \ change \ rooms, \ referee \ change \ room \ and \ a \ universal \ public \ washroom.$
- $\bullet \ \ Improving \ the \ parking \ lot \ infrastructure \ and \ upgrading \ storm \ water \ management \ systems \ at \ the \ CSC.$

Construction is anticipated to start in April 2024 and public use is projected to start in early 2025. Impacts of construction are:

- The natural turf field will be closed for the duration of construction. Access to the CSC, Annex and outdoor fields 1, 2 and 3 will remain open.
- The west parking lot at the CSC will be closed during construction. People needing to park at the CSC during construction can use the north parking entrance or utilize street parking along 48th Street or 68th Avenue S.E.

Once complete, citizens will have access to a high-quality, year-round practice and play space. It will be bookable by anyone. Uses include soccer, lacrosse and field hokey. For information.

Green Line 78th Avenue Work Update.

As part of the Early Works to prepare for Green Line construction in Ogden, several projects are taking place in the community, including a pedestrian tunnel near 72 Ave. S.E., and a vehicle tunnel and road upgrades at 78 Ave. S.E. Once the tunnel at 78 Ave. S.E. is complete and open to traffic, the vehicle crossing at 69 Ave. S.E. will be permanently closed.

Road upgrades to 78 Ave. S.E. between Ogden Rd. S.E. and 27 St. S.E. are set to begin in April, which include widening the road and adding new sidewalks and a cycle path. This section of road will be closed to vehicles and pedestrians until early September and will include detours throughout the three stages of work. Access to driveways and alleyways may be temporarily impacted and Canada Post boxes will be temporarily relocated. Waste and recycling services will continue as normal throughout the work.

Once the tunnel underneath Canadian Pacific Kansas City's rail line at 78 Ave. S.E. is complete in Summer 2025, it will connect to a roundabout built on the east side of the tunnel. This roundabout will allow trucks travelling on Ogden Dale Rd. S.E. to remain on designated truck routes without entering the community.






